Hello West Bedford High Families,

Hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving Holiday Weekend. Our grade 7 and 8 students had a great time at the dance on Thursday, great to see them have so much fun. Please see the below information for the upcoming week.

1. **Attendance Reporting. Reporting an absence must be done via phone call or email:**

**Lates:** We are having a higher volume of lates in the morning (non-bus related) over the last few weeks. Please make sure your child is arriving at school no later than 9:10am in the morning as doors lock at 9:15am. Students with significant lates will start to get phone calls home as arriving to school on time is part of the Provincial Student Attendance and Engagement policy.

2. **Picking up students end of day at West Bedford (pylons have now been put on the road by HRP).** Due to traffic, bussing and safety concerns at the end of day, we are asking parents not to park on the road when picking up your child. This is causing challenges for our buses and safety concerns for our students. Going forward, please park in the lower parking lot in any spaces available at the end of the day only. Most of the elementary staff have left at this point and lots of spaces are open. We have also worked with HRCE operations and have created at least 20 visitor parking spaces in the lower parking that are on the right as soon as you drive in. These will be available any

time of the day if you are visiting. Signage will be up shortly. Thanks for your attention to this as student safety is very important.

4. **Grade 9 FIT (Flexible Instructional time).** Starting next week (Oct. 22), grade 9's will get to experience FIT time during integrated learning time. Every second Tuesday, first period in the morning, grade 9 students will have the option to sign up for a place to work in the building such as library, mezzanine, cafeteria, gym, hallways, etc. Students can work on whatever subject they want, seek out teachers for extra help, get a little extra gym time, etc. This was a huge success for our students last year as they found this time very useful to get ahead, see a teacher about something they needed additional support with, get caught up, work with friends from another class, etc. This also helps students get an idea of what some aspects of grade 10 FIT time will be like.
