## 1) Grade 8 and 9 reconfiguration and grades 10/11 Course requests

**Timeline:** New teachers will be hired in the next week as long as applicants are qualified for new positions. New classes will be created, and schedules will change.

<u>What this will mean for Grade 8 and 9 students</u> A new grade 8 and 9 class will be created from students currently enrolled in 8-1 to 8-4 and 9-1 to 9-8 and all English classes will follow a new schedule. This will create smaller class sizes in both grade 8 and grade 9.

Our teachers will be mindful of creating a new class that balances students' diverse learning needs, while also taking social considerations into account. We thank you in advance for your cooperation with this and will update those impacted as soon as possible.

<u>What this will mean for students in Grade 7-11</u> With the additional homeroom for grade 8 and now 9 we will have course changes that impact the entire school. At the same time we added additional sections of some courses to better address course requests for the senior high level (10 and 11). New schedule is on target for Tuesday, Oct. 1. If a student in grade 10/11 ends up in a new course that better matches their course selection, they will not be responsible to complete any of the work completed so far, they will start with what the teacher and class are currently doing.

- 2. **Curriculum Night (date changed).** Tuesday, Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> 6:30 to 8:00pm. We have changed the date of curriculum night due to the addition of two new homeroom classes and the affect this will have on our students' schedules. We want to make sure you are sitting in front of the teachers your children will have and not come in this week, only to have it change in the next few days.
- 3. Casual Student Monitor Position. We are currently seeking a person interested in a casual Student Monitor position at our school. This position is 6 hours each day from Monday to Friday. High School Attendance. Students who are attending West Bedford High (Grades 7 – 11) are not on the Automated Attendance System that some of you may have been used to at the Elementary level. To report an absence, please call 902-405-0442 and press (1), or send an email to <u>wbhsa@hrce.ca</u>. When leaving a phone message please provide student's full name, homeroom/TA, etc.

If a student needs to leave during the day parents must call in and students can then sign themselves out in the main office. The absence is put into Power School as an unexcused absence until a parent calls to excuse it. Parents will receive phone calls for any unexcused absences at the end of the day.

5. Student Fees (overdue). We still have many students who have not paid their student fees. We have one of the lowest student fees of all students in HRM. These funds are used directly for students and events that occur over the course of the year. Students cannot participate in school sports, clubs, etc. if fees have not been paid. Student fee - \$10.00 – please pay through school cash online. If you cannot pay through school cash online, you can pay by cash or cheque at the school.
