Hello West Bedford High Families,

Please see the below information for the upcoming weeks.

- 1. **Report Cards**. Our first report cards will be sent out Wednesday Nov. 27. This will be sent through email and will contain a link to your child's report card and the instructions on how to access it.
- 2. Attendance (grade 10/11). Students are expected to be in their scheduled classroom for all set classes. Student success is directly linked to the relationship built in the classroom setting. This can only occur if students attend classes. Our grade 10 and 11 flexible model builds in a proactive intervention by having FIT (Flexible instructional time) that is different from any other high school in the province. Students in grade 10/11 are not sitting in set classes all day, thus when they have set class, it is even more important they are attending to get that vital instruction. As outlined in the Student <u>Attendance and Engagement Policy.pdf</u>, teachers have already sent home emails/calls about student absence at the 5% and 10% marker. Once students get past this point, administrators take on communication with student and family. Please know that an administrator will be contacting home in the next few weeks for any students with excessive absences. If absenteeism continues, we will be enforcing consequences in line with the Provincial Code of Conduct and Student Attendance and Engagement policies. Please talk to your student about the importance of attendance. If you receive an automated call for an absence, speak to your child and help them understand the risks and consequences of non attendance. Again, West Bedford High is the only high school that provides students FIT time. This feature of our school is a built-in proactive strategy of attendance support. Skipping classes is an unacceptable behaviour.
- 3. Library (Grade 10/11). Our library is once again becoming an area where some students are beginning to hang out and not use it as a place to work. Many of our students who use this area as a workspace are getting frustrated by the noise and disruptive behaviours. We will be diligently enforcing the use of this space as a quieter, academic space over the next few weeks to ensure it is being used appropriately. If students want a space where they can be a little louder while working, the cafeteria is the space to be. Students who do not adhere to this will have the privilege of using the library removed for a period of time and home will be contacted. Please discuss this with your child.
- 4. Parent/Teacher Meet. Parent/teacher is Thursday, December 5th at 1:00 -3:00pm and 5:30 to 7:30pm. A link to sign for an appointment will be sent out this Thursday evening.

6. **High school (grades 9-11) summative assessments January 27-30.** Please take note of the following important information regarding formal examinations and attendance. Summative assessment events are a standard assessment and evaluation practice for all high schools in Nova Scotia. For this reason, HRCE plans a final exam schedule in their annual calendar which is published in the spring of the previous academic year. Given that exam dates are published well in advance, it is expected that family vacations, or other non-medical absences will be scheduled around this important assessment time. Absence for any reason other than a medical excuse will not be considered an acceptable reason for not writing an exam. Exams will not be proctored at an alternate location.

There may be instances when the school is closed during the scheduled exam day due to inclement weather, a power failure, or other unforeseen circumstances. Exams will be moved forward a day when a situation like this happens. It is important to understand that the student must be present to write the exam on the rescheduled date. Please take this into account when planning and scheduling family vacations around exam time.

Note: Where a student misses an examination without an acceptable excuse as defined above, a mark of zero will be given. International students will receive a zero on their exam if airline tickets are booked early and the student misses an exam.
