The first day of school is Thursday, September 5, 2024

As students arrive, they are asked to enter the doors on the green side of the building. At that point, grade 7& 8 students will be directed to the gymnasium, grade 9 cafeteria and grade 10 & 11 students will go to their TA class. Grade 7-9s will be greeted by their homeroom teacher and taken to their homeroom class. 7-9 Homeroom class lists will be posted on the walls in the gym and cafeteria.

FEES FOR THE 2024/2025 SCHOOL YEAR



STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

WBH Student Expectations

- 1. Come to school prepared for the day EVERYDAY!
- 2. Be on time for your classes. For grade 10/11, this also applies to FIT (flexible instructional time). You have a few minutes to get to each class or designated work area.
- 3. Students are expected to stay in class and/or remain in area they are working in. There is to be no hall walking even for those with FIT in grade 10/11. Students in grade 10/11 are expected to plan where they will be during FIT.
- Vaping or smoking is against the law! It is illegal to vape or smoke on school property. You will be suspended and referred to Halifax Police for an offence ticket under the Smoke Free Act.
- 5. Respect yourself and others WBH is an inclusive environment and any language that is demeaning in nature will not be tolerated. This includes but is not limited to racist, sexist or homophobic language.
- 6. Remember we are in an educational institution and as such language should be appropriate for a school setting. This also lends itself to clothing which should be free of discriminatory or inappropriate language or images. Clothing should also not promote drug, smoking or alcohol use.
- 7. Remember we are members of a community. As such, you are expected to treat all members of the community and property with dignity and respect.
- 8. Attendance is mandatory under the Education Act. Attendance is monitored on a daily basis. If excessive classes are missed, administration will address this issue under the Student Attendance and Engagement Policy. Teacher Advisors for students in grade 10/11 will also be monitoring attendance.
- 9. Stay on top of your schoolwork. It may not be easy and time goes fast in high school. Time management is the best tool for keeping yourself organized and achieving your academic goals. Students in grade 10 need to use their planner and FIT time well and strive to complete the work plans they make for each day.

10. Cellphones and social media new provincial cell phone policy. Guidelines to come in separate document.

- 11. Social Media should be used responsibly. When you are in school or accessing the school network, you must follow the online terms and conditions of use. Any violation may result in suspension of network access or discipline through the Code of Conduct.
- 12. Grade 10/11 students. FIT (Flexible instructional time) is not a free block. Students cannot leave the school during this time. Students use this time to complete work, meet with teachers, etc. If a student needs to leave the school a parent/guardian must call in and excuse their child. Chronic absences will be dealt with under the Provincial Student Attendance and Engagement Policy (see website for policy details).
