1. **Mid-Year Summative Assessments( Grades 9-11).** Students in grades 9-11 will be writing mid-year assessments from January 27-30. Other courses prior to assessment week will be conducting process exams in their courses. This is common in all high schools depending on the nature of the course.

Please take note of the following important information regarding formal examinations and attendance. Summative assessment events are a standard assessment and evaluation practice all high schools in Nova Scotia. For this reason, HRCE plans a final exam schedule in their annual calendar which is published in the spring of the previous academic year. Given that exam dates are published well in advance, it is expected that family vacations, or other non-medical absences will be scheduled around this important assessment time. Absence for any reason other than a medical excuse will not be considered an acceptable reason for not writing an exam. Exams will not be proctored at an alternate location.

## \*\*Due to grade 9 assessments not being final assessments, other possible exceptions can be made, but must be approved through your child's Vice Principal. See information below to contact VP.

There may be instances when the school is closed during the scheduled exam day due to inclement weather, a power failure, or other unforeseen circumstances. Exams will be moved forward a day when a situation like this happens. It is important to understand that the student must be present to write the exam on the rescheduled date. Please take this into account when planning and scheduling family vacations around exam time.

Note: Where a student misses an examination without an acceptable excuse as defined above, a mark of zero will be given. International students will receive a zero on their exam if airline tickets are booked early and the student misses an exam.

• If a student cannot make an assessment time for a major reason (medical) arrangement and approval must go through West Bedford admin team. Please contact your child's VP by Friday, January 17<sup>th</sup>.

- Grade 7/8 Oval Field Trip. On Monday January 27th, the grade 7 & 8 students have the opportunity to participate in a winter ice skating field trip to the Emera Oval. Students attending the trip will miss periods 2 & 3 on this day. The cost for this trip will be \$6 per student. This fee will cover the bus ride to and from the Oval (*the school is covering a portion of the buses in order to have this lower cost for students to maximize participation*). This fee can be paid on SchoolCash only. This is a first come-first serve participation activity that is open to all students in grade 7 and 8 there are only 132 spots available (3 busses).

All Jr High students have been given permission forms this week in their PE classes - completed forms should be returned to any of the PE teachers. <u>A student will not be guaranteed a spot until their form is passed in AND they have paid the fee on SchoolCash.</u>
