Morning Routine

- As students arrive, they are asked to enter the doors on the green side of the building.

- Grade 7-9 will be greeted by their teacher and taken to their homeroom. 7-9 class lists will be posted on the walls in the gym and cafeteria.

Any student that wishes to have a locker will need to pay a school lock fee. The cost of the lock is \$5.00 (cash only). Please send a private email to your child's VP if you are unable to pay a fee at this time or at all. Students are permitted to share a locker with a friend, in this case, the fee remains at \$5 divided by 2.

Non-school locks are not permitted and will be removed if put on a locker.

Lockers will be available for sign up during lunch times the first week of school. Make sure you listen to announcements!

West Bedford High Schools hours of operation are from 8:55 am-3:45 pm. Students are not permitted in the building outside of these hours unless under the direct supervision of a teacher for extra help or an extracurricular activity.

^{**} Students go to ILT (grades 7-9) or PBL (grades 10-12) first period on Tuesdays.

- Grade 7 and 8 students are not permitted to leave the school property during their lunch. This is reserved for Grades 9-12.
- Students must remain in the cafeteria from 12:30-12:45.
 They can then choose to stay inside or head outside onto the designated spaces (more information to come).
- There are sport teams, intramurals, student council, clubs and other activities for the grade 7 and 8's. (More information to come)
- In the mornings, Grade 7 and 8's can go up to their homerooms at 8:55 when the doors open.
- If a student is leaving early, a parent/guardian must call/email the school to excuse the student. Students cannot excuse themselves.
- Grade 7 and 8 are released from class at 3:18 pm to allow time to get to their lockers and out to their buses.
 Bus students can wait inside or in the bus loop.
- Bus Numbers are are written on a whiteboard in the main entrance are as they come in. They are also posted on X @WBHBusDeparture.
- Walkers can leave the building on their own.

Grade 7/8 Info

- Grade 7 and 8's stay with their homeroom classes but move from room to room, teacher to teacher. They do not remain in the same classroom all day.
- Weekly updates are sent out Sunday evenings by our Principal. Please ensure you review.
- If you are experiencing concerns, please reach out to your child's teachers first. They know your child best and can normally assist with questions or concerns.



Grade 7/8 Info

Grade 7-8 students have to remain inside from 12:30-12:45. The cafeteria is available for them to eat lunch in.

At 12:45 they have a few options:

Remain in the cafeteria, head to the field to play in the designated zone, play on the basketball courts in front of the school, utilize the playground/court in front of the school. The lower basketball courts are **off limits** to the grade 7-8s.

Grade 7 and 8 students cannot leave property at lunch.



Grade 7/8 Lunch

Grade 9-12 students can remain in the school for lunch or leave property.

If they choose to stay at school, they can be in the cafeteria, the library or in a space supervised by a teacher. **Ground zero is off limits for lunch times**. The field can be utilized in their designated area and the lower basketball court is for 9-12 only.

PowerSchool is the student information system used by Nova Scotia public schools. The parent/guardian portal allows you to see your child's grades, assignments, schedule and attendance.

You will receive a phone call nightly if your child misses a class and is not excused.

Cell Phone Policy at WBH

WBH aligned with other local high schools to come up with our response when cell phones are used:

Response to Student Cell Phone/Airpod Use

- Cell phone use addressed by the teacher and the student is immediately referred to the office.
- Teacher contacts the office and completes an incident tracking form (PowerSchool). The teacher will not ask or take the phone. Students are expected to go directly to the office and wait to see an administrator.
- Discipline will be addressed in a progressive manner with consequences that align with the Provincial Code of Conduct.

First Offense: Meet with the student, review expectations and home will be contacted-letter sent via email.

Second Offense: Suspend from school for one day.

Repeated Offenses: Suspension, parent meeting and individual cell phone plan.





If students want to listen to music in class or hallways, they **MUST** use wired headphones. Wireless airpods or headphones are not permitted in class. Airpods are **NOT** permitted in any area other than the cafeteria, mezzanine and library. This aligns with the cell phone policy and the sames rules apply-one warning given, then suspension.



Student Expectations at WBH-Grades 7-12

- Come to school prepared to learn EVERYDAY!
- Be on time for your classes.
- There is no wandering of the halls during class time. Excessive wandering will result in an office referral.
- Vaping or smoking is against the law and not permitted at WBH. We enforce fines and follow the HRCE policy on vaping.
- Respect yourself and others-WBH is an inclusive environment and any language/actions that is demeaning in nature will not be tolerated. We follow the provincial Code of Conduct at WBH. <u>Link</u>
- We have gender neutral, single stall washrooms throughout the school. There should never be more than one
 person in a bathroom stall. More than one person will result in an office referral.
- We are members of a larger community. As such, you are expected to treat all members of the community and all property with respect.



Student Expectations at WBH-Grades 7-12

- Attendance is mandatory under the Education Act. Attendance is monitored daily. If excessive classes are
 missed, administration will address this issue under the Student Attendance and Engagement Policy. TA's
 also support this for grade 10-12. <u>Link</u>
- Stay on top of your school work. Grade 10-12 must use their agendas to help support organization and learning.
- As outlined in the provincial cell phone directive, there are no cell phones permitted in the academic wings
 and classrooms of the school. All guidelines will be reviewed in the first days of school. For high school
 students, there are only 3 areas at WBH where phones are allowed: Cafeteria, Library and Mezzanine. No other
 areas permit cell phones. Link
- Social media is to be used responsibly. Violations will be supported through the Code of Conduct. No video or
 pictures of others may be taken within the school.
- Grade 10-12 students are expected to be at school during their scheduled FIT (flexible time) time to ensure
 work is completed. Students leaving the school for any longer than one period, must sign out and parents
 must call and excuse their child if they are leaving, as you would for any other absence. This will be
 monitored.
