Update message - April 28, 2024

Dear WBH Wolves and families,

Please review the information below to help plan for the coming week and what is happening at West Bedford High.

- 1. Last Weeks News (grade 7 and 8 coming part of the high school). We know the message sent out by HRCE last week has created a lot of uncertainly for families, as many are looking for information on how all this will work. Please know that we will be working on this over the next few weeks and have more answers for you in the coming weeks. Couple of things to point out at this time:
 - Grade 7 and 8 have technically already been on our side and moving through the building to classes on the lower level all year. We will continue to do our best to keep it this way. We will maintain our spaces for high school. What I mean is we will do our best keep 7 and 8 in the spaces they already exist. Our wings will remain the same, we also get the CPA wing back and a possible modular. Our spaces that high school students go for flex will continue to be those spaces for high school.
 - The impact will be on how we schedule our gym, how we structure lunch, and bussing and this is what we will be working on with HRCE over the next few weeks.
 - Many schools throughout the province work this way and I will be reaching out to those schools to see what is really working for them and things to think about. Eastern Shore District high school here in HRCE will be opening next year, combining the old high school and Gaetz Brook Junior high in a new 7-12. Many private schools also operate this way.
 - Junior High and High school sports will still be separate. In a 7-12 school, students in grade 7-9 can try out for both high school and junior high sports. We will be running both.
 - Clubs and other extracurricular activities will also run at each level.
 - We have built a great thing here at West Bedford and you and your children have helped us do this and we are committed to making this all work to best of our ability. Please feel free to reach out to me with your questions and concerns and I will compile them and answer them to the best of my ability as we figure things out. Thank you for all of the support you have given us this year, it has been truly appreciated.
- Student Success Survey. Will be completed this week. Grade 10 students will complete Tuesday morning during TA time and grade 9 will complete in English or math class as they have theses courses every day.
